New Name- Bureau of Standards and Instructional Support (BSIS)



The name was once the Bureau of Instruction and Innovation (BII) and then transitioned to the Bureau of Curriculum and Instruction (BCI). Because the Florida Department of Education (FDOE) does not mandate curriculum, it was decided to once again change the name of the bureau. Regardless, the url is still http://www.fldoe.org/bii.

Current statute says "Next Generation Sunshine State Standards", but when referring specifically to CCSS, it states "Next Generation Sunshine State Standards (Common Core)." Statute changes annually.

Regardless, some of you have noticed on CPALMS that some standards say MAFS instead of the MACC that you're used to seeing. MACC stands for Mathematics Common Core, and MAFS stands for Mathematics Florida Standards. Nothing is permanent until it is approved by the State Board of Education. Therefore, IGNORE the 2014-2015 course descriptions right now.

None of this should change the goal- quality instruction. Don't get side-tracked with the changes that won't make a difference to instruction.

#### **Proposed Standards Changes**

Updated- 24 standards

Deleted- 2 standards (both in elementary)

New- 8 standards (7 in elementary and 1 in secondary)

Kept NGSSS- 52 standards



Again, nothing is permanent until it is approved by the State Board of Education, but the following sixteen slides show the standards that have proposed changes and which mathematics courses will be affected. Wording was changed/added to 24 standards for clarity. Two standards were deleted, one of which was moved to a new grade level becoming a new standard in that grade. There were 8 newly created standards. Some say that there are 60 newly created standards because they are combining the 8 with the 52, but those 52 NGSSS standards that have been kept are all from the calculus strand. The wording was not changed in any way. They need to be kept in order for Pre-Calculus and Calculus to still be offered.

The new standards have an *a* or a *b* as the 5th place holder in order not to mess up any of the clusters. They can be seen on CPALMS at <a href="http://www.cpalms.org/Public/search/Search">http://www.cpalms.org/Public/search/Search</a>. Click *CCSS: Mathematics*. Choose the appropriate grade level, domain, and cluster. Remember, the standard with *a* or *b* as the 5th place holder is the new standard.

#### 2013-2014 Courses

There are **6** courses, outside of those that have a blended course description, that still contain NGSSS.

What will happen?



The following four slides show the effect.

#### Liberal Arts Mathematics 1 and 2

The financial literacy standards from NGSSS will be removed from both courses, but the courses will remain.



Though financial literacy is very important, that will no longer be held within the mathematics standards. New financial literacy standards, once approved, will be housed with the social studies standards and placed in the economics course(s).

# Pre-Calculus Honors and Calculus Honors

These courses will remain, and the 52 standards in the calculus strand of the NGSSS will become Florida's Standards.



Remember, wording was not changed in any way.

# Advanced Algebra with Financial Applications

This course will be daggered and unavailable for use in 2015-2016.



Be careful. If you offer this course in 2014-2015 and a student fails, how will they grade recover?

### **Analytic Geometry Honors**

This course will be daggered and unavailable for use in 2015-2016.

There are no AP courses that could be substituted, but consider dual enrollment Analytic Geometry (MACX154).

## Florida Department of EDUCATION

The deadline for completion of the 2013-2014 Instructional Materials Adoption (6-12) has again been extended. Please note, there were over 150+ bids that must be evaluated by two expert reviewers, and upon a tie, a third expert reviewer will be allocated as a tie-breaker. Currently, we removed four mathematics courses from the current 2013 adoption schedule due to lack of reviewers recruited and follow-through of allocated bids by some reviewers. Although more reviewers were recently acquired, many who had initially offered to help have dropped out. Per Instructional Materials, if at least 20 more reviewers are not obtained, the **middle school mathematics** submissions for the 2013-2014 Instructional Materials Adoption (6-12) will not be reviewed. Please reach out to any and all who you think are qualified to review these materials. Instructional Materials has said that it is *not* mandatory for the reviewers to be in Florida, though a familiarity/knowledge of Florida's standards would obviously be helpful!

In an effort to provide school districts with additional scheduling flexibility and optimal instructional time prior to testing, the spring 2014 EOC assessment schedule has been modified as follows.

- •Subjects may be administered in ANY order, by school, based on the needs of students within that school. One subject test does not need to be completed before another begins, and subject tests may be administered concurrently. All subjects may begin on April 21;however, districts must complete all testing by the designated date for each subject area.
- •U.S. History, Civics, and Algebra 1 administrations must be completed no later than May16.
- •Biology 1 and Geometry administrations must be completed no later than May 23.
- •This additional scheduling flexibility will allow for all makeup tests for absent students to be administered during the regular testing window, which will ensure that these students




Due to interest expressed on behalf of the approximately 10,000 remaining students required to pass the FCAT Mathematics Retake who have not yet met this graduation requirement, the department will offer three additional administrations of the FCAT Mathematics Retake. These administrations are being implemented to provide opportunities for students who entered grade 9 in 2009 or earlier to meet the mathematics assessment graduation requirement at no cost to students. ACT and SAT concordant scores may still be used to meet this requirement, as described in the document at http://fcat.fldoe.org/pdf/fcatpass.pdf. Please note the following.

- •The FCAT Mathematics Retake will be administered in spring and fall of 2014 and for the last time in spring of 2015.
- •The spring 2014 FCAT Mathematics Retake will be administered during the currently established administration window for the FCAT 2.0 Reading Retake (April 7-15).


